I also ask that you pray for guidance as I have conversations with four new churches showing interest in working with the ministry and to provide clarity on how I can best serve these men and churches.

About a month ago, Pat asked me to write my section of this newsletter. Some of you may know that this is not something I jump on right away. While I appreciate your positive feedback to what I write, and I feel it is important to add my perspective of what's happening in our lives and in my mind, I really don't enjoy the task of writing.

So about a month ago, I had just returned from Grand Cayman from a wonderful vacation with my sister. Through her hard work with Apple Education Sales, she earned a week-long Caribbean vacation and invited me to be her guest. I was so happy to help her out! I was reflecting on all the blessings we had in our life. We celebrated a wonderful Christmas season with family and friends, we have been blessed with the means to purchase a newer, more reliable van, and I enjoyed a wonderful week at the beach. Thank you, God!

Shortly after my return, Pat called me one morning with news that any parent dreads to hear. The two-year old son of some friends of ours had passed away during his afternoon nap. Having a two-year old son of my own, I grieved for this

mother and father and prayed that somehow, God would comfort them in their loss. Pat and I stood in line at the funeral home for two hours to be able to hug them and share our condolences with them. This faith filled couple received friends and loved ones for seven hours that day. I thought that surely, they would collapse and wondered how they were able to withstand the physical and emotional toll this was taking in their lives.

The following Monday morning, we received a phone call from Pat's Mom. Our brother-in-law, Rick Kool was in ICU with complications from the flu. Though we do not understand why precious people in our lives die or are sick or why we have healthy children or get to go to Grand Cayman, I know that God has a perfect plan. It is all that I can count on and believe in. There is nothing else in this world that can provide such Hope. Praise be to God!
