The seminar exceeded my expectations. Each leader and pastor attending was eager to listen and apply all that was shared. It was a blessing to model how discipleship can **ripple through a church** congregation **one man at a time**.

GOD AT WORK THROUGH MAC MINISTRIES

Like a lot of men, my walk with God has not always been consistent. There have been some short stretches when I feel like I was sprinting straight ahead, completely focused on God and on my relationship with Him. Other times, wandering in circles might be a better description. And, sadly, even more time has been spent sitting off to the side, going nowhere as I made little effort and less progress.

What I've come to learn along the way is the importance of having others – specifically other men – walking alongside and spurring you forward. That's a central theme of Men Abiding in Christ Ministries and I am one of the many who have benefited from having Pat come alongside me on my walk.

Pat was launching a Christian Leadership Concepts group at our church – this was a more intensive discipleship effort requiring a two-year commitment. I attended some introductory meetings but in the end chose not to join the 12-man CLC group because I felt unprepared spiritually and quite honestly, was intimidated by the time commitment keeping up with the daily readings and Bible study.

Although, I had opted out, Pat stuck with me by inviting me and another to meet with him on a weekly basis. What I learned from my time with these two men is that its much easier to be **intentional** about growing in your faith when you're not doing it alone. I always had the best intentions, but without the accountability and schedule of regular meetings, I allowed it to slip. Pat continued to mentor me through our small triad and when a second CLC group was planned at our church, he invited me again. This time, God not only eased my concerns about the time commitment, but more importantly He gave me a true desire to pick up my walk with Him.

Now I look forward to our CLC group's weekly 6 a.m. meetings. The daily study comes easily and is rewarding. I've found that I share many of the same challenges and blessings as the other men in my group. We each continue down our own path with the Lord, **but we don't walk alone**.
