Even when I can see how powerful God is at work in someone, like when a man makes the decision to follow Jesus, I hesitate. I know first-hand that he will be facing adversity in the days and weeks to come. I've experienced this enough in my own life where I make a decision to lay my burden at the cross and I expect that God will just release me from the difficulties and trials.


Do you know what I mean? Have you felt this way?

It can be really difficult to keep saying "trust in the Lord" week after week after week. Especially when it doesn't feel like it's getting any better.

It's during these times that I make myself embrace Proverbs 3: 5-6; "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understandings. Acknowledge Him in all your ways, and He will make your paths straight." Like many of us, especially the man mentioned above, our backs are up against the wall. It's hard to trust God because He doesn't seem to be meeting my expectations. But if I wait humbly on the Lord and just trust then I start to see things differently.

I'm walking with a man who has lived off his savings for the past 18 months and it's out, with nothing on the horizon for the future. Another is struggling to believe that there is any hope for his marriage to mend. In situations like this, sitting still and waiting is not something that comes easy to me, or the men I meet with. Read any of the Psalms and you will quickly see that it takes great strength to wait and trust. Though its through this waiting and trusting that you see God is molding, shaping, and sharpening our core. And then I'm grateful that my lack of understanding did not interfere.
